The Chapter General Meeting at the Town & Country Club on September 18th was an energizing success! It was wonderful to see so many members there to kick off the new year. If you missed it, here are a few highlights:

FEATURED SCHOLAR PRESENTATION

We heard from Frankie Gerraty of UC Santa Cruz, who is pursuing a PhD with no fewer than four land-sea ecology dissertation topic interactions, focusing on California Coast coyotes and seals. While his talk generated lots of questions (including about the booming SF urban coyote situation!), his description of the impact of the ARCS award and his tenacity in finding grant sources as a "self-funded PhD" was stunning. His ARCS award has allowed him to travel to gather novel data from up and down the West Coast.

BIO: Frankie Gerraty is an Australian-American biologist, storyteller, and PhD student at UC Santa Cruz. His research examines ecosystem

connectivity along human-disturbed coastlines, with a focus on how humans influence pathways of marine-to-terrestrial nutrient transfer. Frankie's research findings have been featured in *The Mercury News, Los Angeles Times*, and *SFGate*, and his scientific accomplishments have garnered him numerous awards including grants from the National Science Foundation, Explorers Club, PADI Foundation, Western Society of Naturalists, and the American Museum of Natural History. Dedicated to community engagement and science storytelling, he hosts a natural history podcast for KSQD Santa Cruz public radio and his creative nonfiction stories have been published by *The Center for Humans and Nature* and *Loam*. In his free time, he enjoys reading, surfing, listening to birds, raising houseplants, rock climbing, and exploring rocky intertidal zones.
